At our institution, we emphasize the importance of addressing significant societal challenges by integrating them into our established curriculum. Key topics such as Professional Ethics, Gender Equality, Human Values, Environment, and Sustainability are essential elements of our academic offerings. Within the Political Science program for second and third-year students, we examine various ideologies with a strong focus on advancing gender equality. Human Values are also a pivotal aspect of our educational framework. Our Choice-Based Credit System mandates a foundational course titled 'Democracy, Decentralization, and Governance' for first-year undergraduate and postgraduate students, which introduces them to constitutional principles. In the realm of Professional Ethics, our postgraduate course 'Introduction to Cyber Security/Information Security' equips students with a thorough understanding of Cybercrime, Terrorism, Security Laws, and Intellectual Property Rights. We also provide courses such as 'Business Ethics' and 'Professional Values' at both undergraduate and postgraduate levels. To tackle Environmental and Sustainability issues, all second-year undergraduate students are required to complete a compulsory credit course in Environmental Studies, which covers Ecology, Ecosystems, Environmental Pollution Control technologies, and conservation

strategies. Additionally, we emphasize the significance of sustainable energy sources in our curriculum; for example, in the first year of the B.Sc. (Computer Science) program and the F.Y.B.Sc. in Physics, we include 'Solar Cells' as a key topic, illustrating the benefits of solar energy compared to traditional energy sources.

Departments including Mathematics, Statistics, Physics, Chemistry, Economics, and English effectively employ this strategy to enhance students' educational experiences. Various innovative measures have been implemented to improve the effectiveness of teaching and learning. The college supports the proficient use of resources such as PowerPoint presentations, LCD projectors, eBooks, journals, and advanced laboratory equipment. It also offers access to computers and laptops, 50 Mbps internet connectivity, INFLIBNET, DELNET, Shodhganga, and other ICT facilities to facilitate effective educational experiences. The English Department has introduced a Language Laboratory to enhance students' English language skills, while smart classroom facilities have been established for efficient knowledge dissemination. The Chemistry Department utilizes Chem-draw ultra software for compound structure visualization, and the Statistics Department employs R-software and Excel. Additionally, the Mathematics Department has integrated software like Maxima, Python, LaTeX, and C Programming to bolster students' learning capabilities. Essential learning materials and resources are accessible on the college website, and faculty members actively distribute study materials and notes through internet platforms. In terms of mobile technology, educators leverage smartphones and applications such as WhatsApp to improve verbal skills and visual learning.

Following evaluation, the respective subject teacher holds individual meetings with students to discuss their performance in detail and provide guidance for improvement in future assessments. The teacher maintains comprehensive records of internal assessments for future reference by college authorities in the event of complaints. Re-examinations are offered to students who were absent during internal assessments due to participation in NCC, NSS, sports, cultural activities, or medical issues.

### 2.5.2 - Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, time- bound and efficient

The college has established an examination committee responsible for addressing grievances related to examinations. The grievance redressal process adheres to the university's established norms. Students with concerns regarding internal examinations must submit an application to the Chief Examination Officer (CEO) detailing their issues. The CEO will then consult with the relevant department head and faculty member. Grievances are addressed by reviewing the student's performance on the answer sheet or by having the answer sheet re-evaluated by another examiner in the presence of the student. Any discrepancies in marks or assessments identified by students are promptly corrected by faculty members. For grievances concerning university examinations, students can register their complaints regarding online assessments within 48 hours through their profiles. Issues related to errors on hall tickets, such as incorrect names or subjects, are forwarded to the university, which ensures that corrected hall tickets are issued in a timely manner. If students are dissatisfied with the university's evaluation, they are permitted to apply for revaluation and rechecking by paying the requisite processing fees and obtaining photocopies of their answer sheets. Queries regarding results, corrections in mark sheets, and other certificates issued by the university are managed by the SPPU examination section, following referral from the college examination section.

The college has established a method for assessing program and course outcomes, aimed at enhancing both educational quality and graduate results. Learning outcomes are evaluated through both direct and indirect approaches. The direct method involves defining the expected learning outcomes for all programs and courses, utilizing established program outcomes, course outcomes, and program-specific outcomes for evaluation. Program outcomes are determined based on predefined target levels, with each course outcome (CO) mapped to a program outcome (PO) to create a CO-PO matrix. The attainment of course outcomes is calculated using the following formula: for undergraduate courses, attainment equals 70% from university examination results and 30% from internal examination results; for postgraduate courses, the same formula applies. The attainment levels for course outcomes are categorized as follows: Level 1 indicates that 40% of students scored above the university average, Level 2 indicates 50%, and Level 3 indicates 60%.

The college, adhering to the Savitribai Phule Pune University curriculum, emphasizes innovation and intellectual growth through activities organized by various cells and departments, including the Research Planning Development Committee, Green Club, ICT Committee, and NSS.

The college's incubation centre fosters knowledge creation and encourages faculty to secure research grants from agencies like DST, DBT, and CSIR. A robust research culture supports faculty and students in undertaking research, participating in seminars, and attending workshops, backed by financial and infrastructural aid.

The Innovation and Incubation Cell and departmental research committees promote major and minor research. Research centres in Chemistry, Marathi, and Political Science engage external scholars.

Departmental events like quizzes, exhibitions, and workshops cultivate scientific and innovative thinking. The central library facilitates research with comprehensive resources.

Faculty achievements include one patent, 13 UGC CARE-listed articles, nine SPPU-approved guideships, and 13 book publications. In 2023-24, three Ph.D. students registered. Students actively participate in research competitions like Aavishkar.

NSS organizes impactful campaigns, and students showcase creativity through the college magazine, "Dnyandeep." A Nanotechnology course offered to T.Y.B.Sc. students included guest lectures and certifications. Industry linkages facilitate internships and training for holistic student development.

A total of 23 initiatives were organized by NSS, NCC, and other departments, focusing on key social issues. Activities included blood donation camps, tree plantation drives, cleanliness campaigns under Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, AIDS awareness programs, and celebrations of national leaders' anniversaries, Women's Day, Teachers' Day, and Voter Awareness campaigns.

The NSS Unit organized a 7-day residential camp in Bahirwadi, an adopted village, conducting activities addressing local social issues. To promote health awareness, the college celebrated Yoga Week on International Yoga Day and organized a first aid camp. Azadi Ka Amrut Mahotsav was celebrated with events like "Meri Mati Mera Desh," Panchpran Pledge, and Republic Day activities to foster nationalism. HIV awareness was raised through testing camps and rallies, while public cleanliness initiatives were conducted year-round.

Two blood donation camps contributed to the government blood bank, and tree plantation drives enhanced environmental awareness. Voter awareness rallies and registration drives were conducted. During Constitution Day week many activities were organized. These activities significantly impacted students' character development and societal contributions.

## INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

### 4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

The college comprises five wings labeled A, B, C, D, and E, each equipped with excellent facilities including classrooms, laboratories, a library, staff rooms, and administrative offices. Wing A houses the commerce department, featuring a well-furnished computer laboratory. Wing B contains well-equipped laboratories for Chemistry, Physics, Botany, and Zoology. Wing C offers substantial

space for the qualitative enhancement of the library, known as the Knowledge Resource Center, which includes reading halls capable of accommodating 200 students comfortably. Wing D is designated for administrative functions, while Wing E includes computer laboratories for B.Sc. Computer Science and BBA programs, as well as a well-equipped laboratory for Mathematics and Statistics. In terms of physical facilities, the college boasts a well-furnished conference hall named Vitthalraoji Buttepatil Sabhagruha, a competitive examination guidance center with a well-maintained reading hall, and dedicated departments for IQAC, the examination office, NCC, NSS, and student welfare. Additionally, there is a separate laboratory for M.Sc. Organic Chemistry, a Geography Laboratory, and computer labs with a bandwidth of 50 Mbps. The Instrumentation Facility Centre is designed to foster a research culture among students and faculty, featuring seven advanced and sophisticated instruments, along with three smart classrooms.

The college offers comprehensive infrastructure to support students pursuing careers in sports, as well as to the broader student body. It features well-equipped, separate gymnasiums for both male and female students. The men's gym, managed by the College Physical Education and Sports Department, spans 530 square feet and includes facilities such as a multistation machine, sealed leg press machine, crossover pulley, angled leg press cum hack machine, shoulder cum chest press machine, exercise bikes, and dumbbells. The women's gym is a dedicated space of 380 square feet. Additionally, the college utilizes its multipurpose ground for various outdoor sports, including handball, korfball, netball, athletics, archery, and ball badminton. To motivate participants in these activities, the college offers scholarships, prizes, certificates, and tracksuits. In terms of cultural activities, the college provides instruments such as harmoniums, guitars, tablas, and casios. The Vitthalraoji Buttepatil Sabhagruh serves as a venue for practicing and performing cultural events like dance, music, and drama, with guidance from faculty to enhance student performance in competitions. Furthermore, the

college organizes cultural programs for guests attending various seminars.

This Library Management System includes various modules such as Book Master, Author Master, CD Master, Book Category Master, Compiler Master, Currency Master, Distributor Master, Editor Master, Language Master, and Publication Master. The software facilitates the creation and viewing of records, including lists of books, subscription details, and records of issued and returned books, as well as vendor information. The Web OPAC feature allows users to check the status of books, including availability, issue status, shelf number, accession number, title, author, and publisher, thereby enabling efficient tracking of library materials. Book records can be generated based on type or category (Text, Reference, or Other), subject (Physics, Chemistry, Biology, History, Accounts, etc.), accession number, publication, and author. The software's issue and return modules manage the issuance, renewal, and overdue status of books. Additionally, a library portal has been created on the college website ([www.hrmrajgurunagar.ac.in](http://www.hrmrajgurunagar.ac.in)) to provide a comprehensive solution for users, offering access to collections, facilities, resources, and circulars, along with important links to INFLIBNET N-List, online newspapers, open access e-resources, online rare book collections, and the Web OPAC.

The Institution performs regular internal and external financial audits. The internal audit is an ongoing process that takes place after each financial transaction, with the auditor designated by the management of Institution KTSP Mandal.

The internal audit involves the examination of fee receipts, official correspondence, official funds, and bank statements. Conversely, the external audit is carried out annually by a Chartered Accountant appointed by KTSP Mandal, typically lasting between 8 to 15 days in May.

During the external audit, the auditor reviews Accession records at three levels: library records, purchase records, and the dead stock of laboratories, as well as the dead stock and equipment of the gymkhana. The auditor also verifies the classification of payments into Revenue Expenditure and Capital Expenditure.

### 1.3 - Curriculum Enrichment

1.3.1 - Institution integrates crosscutting issues relevant to Professional Ethics, Gender, Human Values, Environment and Sustainability into the Curriculum

At our institution, we emphasize the importance of addressing significant societal challenges by integrating them into our established curriculum. Key topics such as Professional Ethics, Gender Equality, Human Values, Environment, and Sustainability are essential elements of our academic offerings. Within the Political Science program for second and third-year students, we examine various ideologies with a strong focus on advancing gender equality. Human Values are also a pivotal aspect of our educational framework. Our Choice-Based Credit System mandates a foundational course titled 'Democracy, Decentralization, and Governance' for first-year undergraduate and postgraduate students, which introduces them to constitutional principles. In the realm of Professional Ethics, our postgraduate course 'Introduction to Cyber Security/Information Security' equips students with a thorough understanding of Cybercrime, Terrorism, Security Laws, and Intellectual Property Rights. We also provide courses such as 'Business Ethics' and 'Professional Values' at both undergraduate and postgraduate levels. To tackle Environmental and Sustainability issues, all second-year undergraduate students are required to complete a compulsory credit course in Environmental Studies, which covers Ecology, Ecosystems, Environmental Pollution Control technologies, and conservation strategies. Additionally, we emphasize the significance of sustainable energy sources in our curriculum; for example, in the first year of the B.Sc. (Computer Science) program and the F.Y.B.Sc. in Physics, we include 'Solar Cells' as a key topic, illustrating the benefits of solar energy compared to traditional energy sources.

A dedicated Examination Department operates in compliance with SPPU's rules and regulations, ensuring that students are informed about the examination patterns, schedules, regulations, and the academic calendar, including CIE exam dates. This information is made accessible through the college website, notice boards, WhatsApp groups, and Google Classroom. Internal assessments are conducted through various methods, including tutorials, unit tests, classroom seminars, assignments, field visits, viva-voce, group discussions, open book tests, presentations, and quizzes. Results of these assessments are announced within a week, allowing students to address any grievances before final marks are submitted to the university. Following evaluation, the respective subject teacher holds individual meetings with students to discuss their performance in detail and provide guidance for improvement in future assessments. The teacher maintains comprehensive records of internal assessments for future reference by college authorities in the event of complaints. 2.5.2 - Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, time- bound and efficient

The college has established an examination committee responsible for addressing grievances related to examinations. The grievance redressal process adheres to the university's established norms. Students with concerns regarding internal examinations must submit an application to the Chief Examination Officer (CEO) detailing their issues. The CEO will then consult with the relevant department head and faculty member. Grievances are addressed by reviewing the student's performance on the answer sheet or by having the answer sheet re-evaluated by another examiner in the presence of the student. Any discrepancies in marks or assessments identified by students are promptly corrected by faculty members. For grievances concerning university examinations, students can register their complaints regarding online assessments within 48 hours through their profiles. Issues related to errors on hall tickets, such as incorrect names or subjects, are forwarded to the university, which ensures that corrected hall tickets are issued in a timely manner. If students are dissatisfied with the university's evaluation, they are permitted to apply for revaluation and rechecking by paying the requisite processing fees and obtaining photocopies of their answer sheets. Queries regarding results, corrections in mark sheets, and other certificates issued by the university are managed by the SPPU examination section, following referral from the college examination section.

The college has established a method for assessing program and course outcomes, aimed at enhancing both educational quality and graduate results. Learning outcomes are evaluated through both direct and indirect approaches. The direct method involves defining the expected learning outcomes for all programs and courses, utilizing established program outcomes, course outcomes, and program-specific outcomes for evaluation. Program outcomes are determined based on predefined target levels, with each course outcome (CO) mapped to a program outcome (PO) to create a CO-PO matrix. The attainment of course outcomes is calculated using the following formula: for undergraduate courses, attainment equals 70% from university examination results and 30% from internal examination results; for postgraduate courses, the same formula applies. The attainment levels for course outcomes are categorized as follows: Level 1 indicates that 40% of students scored above the university average, Level 2 indicates 50%, and Level 3 indicates 60%.

The college, adhering to the Savitribai Phule Pune University curriculum, emphasizes innovation and intellectual growth through

The college's incubation centre fosters knowledge creation and encourages faculty to secure research grants from agencies like DST, DBT, and CSIR. The Innovation and Incubation Cell and departmental research committees promote major and minor research. Research centres in Chemistry, Marathi, and Political Science engage external scholars. Departmental events like quizzes, exhibitions, and workshops cultivate scientific and innovative thinking. The central library facilitates research with comprehensive resources.

Faculty achievements include one patent, 13 UGC CARE-listed articles, nine SPPU-approved guideships, and 13 book publications. In 2023-24, three Ph.D. students registered. Students actively participate in research competitions like Aavishkar.

NSS organizes impactful campaigns, and students showcase creativity through the college magazine, "Dnyandeeep." A Nanotechnology course offered to T.Y.B.Sc. students included guest lectures and certifications. Industry linkages facilitate internships and training for holistic student development.

3.4.1 - Extension activities are carried out in the neighborhood community, sensitizing students to social issues, for their holistic development, and impact thereof during the year

awareness among students through a variety of impactful activities. A total of 23 initiatives were organized by NSS, NCC, and other departments, focusing on key social issues. Activities included blood donation camps, tree plantation drives, cleanliness campaigns under Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, AIDS awareness programs, and celebrations of national leaders' anniversaries, Women's Day, Teachers' Day, and Voter Awareness campaigns.

The NSS Unit organized a 7-day residential camp in Bahirwadi, an adopted village, conducting activities addressing local social issues. To promote health awareness, the college celebrated Yoga Week on International Yoga Day and organized a first aid camp. Azadi Ka Amrut Mahotsav was celebrated with events like "Meri Mati Mera Desh," Panchpran Pledge, and Republic Day activities to foster nationalism. HIV awareness was raised through testing camps and rallies, while public cleanliness initiatives were conducted year-round.

Two blood donation camps contributed to the government blood bank, and tree plantation drives enhanced environmental awareness. Voter awareness rallies and registration drives were conducted. During Constitution Day week many activities were organized. These activities significantly impacted students' character development and societal contributions.

## INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

### 4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

The college comprises five wings labeled A, B, C, D, and E, each equipped with excellent facilities including classrooms, laboratories, a library, staff rooms, and administrative offices. Wing A houses the commerce department, featuring a well-furnished computer laboratory. Wing B contains well-equipped laboratories for Chemistry, Physics, Botany, and Zoology. Wing C offers substantial space for the qualitative enhancement of the library, known as the Knowledge Resource Center, which includes reading halls capable of accommodating 200 students comfortably. Wing D is designated for administrative functions, while Wing E includes computer laboratories for B.Sc. Computer Science and BBA programs, as well as a well-equipped laboratory for Mathematics and Statistics. In terms of physical facilities, the college boasts a well-furnished conference hall named Vitthalraoji Buttepatil Sabhagruha, a competitive examination guidance center with a well-maintained reading hall, and dedicated departments for IQAC, the examination office, NCC, NSS, and student welfare. Additionally, there is a separate laboratory for M.Sc. Organic Chemistry, a Geography Laboratory, and computer labs with a bandwidth of 50 Mbps. The Instrumentation Facility Centre is designed to foster a research culture among students and faculty, featuring seven advanced and sophisticated instruments, along with three smart classrooms.

The college offers comprehensive infrastructure to support students pursuing careers in sports, as well as to the broader student body. It features well-equipped, separate gymnasiums for both male and female students. The men's gym, managed by the College Physical Education and Sports Department, spans 530 square feet and includes facilities such as a multistation machine, sealed leg press machine, crossover pulley, angled leg press cum hack machine, shoulder cum chest press machine, exercise bikes, and dumbbells. The women's gym is a dedicated space of 380 square feet. Additionally, the college utilizes its multipurpose ground for various outdoor sports, including handball, korfbal, netball, athletics, archery, and ball badminton. To motivate participants in these activities, the college offers scholarships, prizes, certificates, and tracksuits. In terms of cultural activities, the college provides instruments such as harmoniums, guitars, tablas, and casios. The Vitthalraoji Buttepatil Sabhagruh serves as a venue for practicing and performing cultural events like dance, music, and drama, with guidance from faculty to enhance student performance in competitions. Furthermore, the college organizes cultural programs for guests attending various seminars.

The Web OPAC feature allows users to check the status of books, including availability, issue status, shelf number, accession number, title, author, and publisher, thereby enabling efficient tracking

of library materials. Book records can be generated based on type or category (Text, Reference, or Other), subject (Physics, Chemistry, Biology, History, Accounts, etc.), accession number, publication, and author. The software's issue and return modules manage the issuance, renewal, and overdue status of books. Each year, committees are rotated to promote faculty development, with approximately 45 committees overseeing college activities.

2. The Institution performs regular internal and external financial audits. The internal audit is an ongoing process that takes place after each financial transaction, with the auditor designated by the management of Institution KTSP Mandal.

The internal audit involves the examination of fee receipts, official correspondence, official funds, and bank statements. Conversely, the external audit is carried out annually by a Chartered Accountant appointed by KTSP Mandal, typically lasting between 8 to 15 days in May.

During the external audit, the auditor reviews Accession records at three levels: library records, purchase records, and the dead stock of laboratories, as well as the dead stock and equipment of the gymkhana. The auditor also verifies the classification of payments into Revenue Expenditure and Capital Expenditure.

2. **Best Practice 2:**

1. The second best practice involves the Student Mentoring System, which aims to match students with mentors or teachers, providing guidelines for their interactions.
2. This practice operates with a student-teacher ratio of 43:1 and utilizes various methods for mentoring sessions, including addressing health issues, assigning tasks, offering tutorials, and providing special guidance.
3. The system also keeps detailed records of these mentoring sessions to identify slow learners and advanced learners effectively.
4. Evidence of success in this practice includes improved academic performance and overall student well-being.
5. However, some problems encountered may include the need for additional resources such as time, training, and support for mentors to effectively carry out their roles in the system.
