BOTANICAL GARDEN AND CAMPUS DEVELOPMET REPORT

The maintenance and development of the HRM campus is carried out under the supervision of the management committee of Khed Taluka Shikshan Prasark Mandal and also the Principal. The memorial of the founder chairman, Late Shri. Sahebraoji Buttepatil is kept well maintained and is beautified by lawn. The plants near the college entrance were given proper training and pruning and kept well in shape. A permanent podium with a flag pole is also well maintained. A total of 4 multi-storey buildings are there functioning at present which are equipped with ramps for differentially abled individuals. Wheel chairs are also made available for those who need it. Construction of new building with spacious classrooms is undergoing in the campus which is expected to start functioning from the next academic year onwards. A polytechnic and management institute under KTSP Mandal also will start to function from the next academic year in the campus.

Shri. Sahebraoji Buttepatil Grahak Bhandar (store) for students is functioning regularly, where stationeries are provided at discounted rates. For conducting the various activities of the college like meetings, conferences etc., Shri. Vitthalrao Buttepatil auditorium is kept well maintained. Facility for pure drinking water is also made sure at various places throughout the campus. Proper care is also taken care of all these facilities.

Gymnasium department of the college is functioning efficiently, where many equipments are available for the use of students and staff. Ladies' hostel having a capacity for 120 students is also running in the campus. Many girl students who come from remote areas are getting advantage of this facility. Solar water heating facility is available in the hostel. A lady in-charge is also appointed for the smooth administration. Many sports facilities are available there for the residents. A well-kept mess is run there which is looked after by the residents themselves.

Under the Botanical Garden and Campus Development Committee, a survey of plants was conducted. A significant number of plants were cut down to make space for the construction of new building. At present, a total of 204 different varieties of plants, most of which are ornamentals, are maintained in the campus. Botanic garden committee along with the Department of Botany is making every effort to revitalize the green cover of the campus within the limited space available. Restoration of the Botanic Garden with a diverse selection of rare and endangered plants and medicinal, ornamental and fruit plants is being planned for execution as and when enough space becomes available.
